From ABA Secretary - Karen Unrath



Greetings from the ABA.

This newsletter (Spring 2023) is a celebratory edition of much hard work in the breeding pens and showrooms from our members. 2022 show reports are complete and there were many milestones met.

These include 4 levels of ABA Awards:

Certificates of Merit (1) – awarded to ABA Members who earn 5 or more starred wins in a single breed and variety. This is not an annual award. ABA members are recognized once per breed and variety when they reach or surpass five starred wins.

Master Exhibitor (2)

This is awarded to an ABA member once they reach 20 starred wins.

Master Breeder (3)

This is awarded to an ABA member once they accumulate 20 or more starred wins in a single breed and variety over a time period of 5 or more years. (Important note: if an ABA members earns 20 starred wins in Blue Cochin over 3 years and then no longer earns any more wins, they DO NOT get awarded Master Breeder when the five year period is over. They MUST earn the wins over a period of five years or more.

Lifetime Achievement award (4)

This final and last award is a cumulative calculation of all the starred wins that an ABA member has won. The wins are "weighted" based on the class size.

- .025 50-99 birds
- .05 100-399 birds
- .20 400-999 birds
- .50 1000-1999 birds
- 1.00 2000 or more birds in the class.

When these win points calculate to a total of 20.00, over a period of 10 years or more, an ABA member is recognized with the ABA

Lifetime Achievement Award.

Much of this year has been devoted to redesigning how we manage the starred win file. This is a substantial improvement in the data integrity and provides you with simplified access to your information. The starred wins are being presented on our website as individual files. These can be accessed on our website under "starred wins". This is still ongoing. If you do not see your name right away, please send me an email and we will get it done.

In this newsletter, I have listed the final listing for 2022 Certificate of Merit, Master Exhibitor, and Master Breeder recipients. These will be highlighted and recognized in the upcoming 2023 ABA yearbook.

2023 yearbook ads are being accepted now on a case-by-case basis. We have officially extended our deadline to June 1, 2023. We continue to work very hard to keep the production costs within expectations, but we must depend on you, our membership to support this project however you can.

Kim Munden (abayearbook@gmail.com) of Pennsylvania is ready to take your text and photos and bring them to life by designing your ad. We will also gladly accept your pre-designed ads as well. 



I hope everyone is on guard for coccidiosis, the dry weather keeps a lot of it at bay and we let our guard down and it sneaks up on us. Medicated feed is not enough during wet times like this, I give my growing birds Corid every other week till they have been on the ground for a while.

The mosquitoes are going to be crazy this year so that means foul pox will be rampant, so I will be vaccinating a little early this year. Probably early June for the first batch and then every other week for the later hatches. I usually go thru 3-4 vials of vaccine a year. That's \$30-\$40 of cheap insurance.

Here on the gulf coast, worms can be a big problem in wet warm years like this so I will start worming the older birds (breeders) in April-May and then the yearlings Midsummer.

Take care of your birds and I will see you this fall.

I got my start from Jim Sallee and using that blood, along with supplemental genetics from other breeders, have progressed my line into something that I am proud of, but still have work to do.

When I first got my birds, I began showing them at local fairs as a member of my high school's FFA chapter. After I graduated, I started showing at open shows and have been having a blast ever since. A couple of my other hobbies include rockhounding and botany. I am currently working toward my Bachelor of Science in Forest management and have worked seasonally as a wildland firefighter for the past few years.

One thing that is important to me regarding our hobby is captivating our youth in what we do, ensuring we have something to pass on. I began my show experience with a great mentor and still lean on them from time to time, even if he doesn't like leghorns;) Many of my friends have become mentors in a way and it just makes the experience that much better when you see them at a show after months. In other words, if you have the ability to, I encourage anyone to take someone under their wing so to speak and help build up the next generation.

They were already banded, so I was able to record those birds and monitor them as they matured to see how they finished out. If I had not recorded them and they changed in some way, I may not have been able to identify them and would have lost information that would help me. Besides pencil and paper, applications like Microsoft Excel and Microsoft Access can be used by the industrious poultryman to keep clear records and are mostly user friendly. Anyways, rant over, cheers to everyone and their future champions this spring.
